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# ABOUT US

### Who We Are:

EPIC Early Learning is a non-profit organization that has been serving the Yakima community for over 40 years. We work hand-in-hand with children and their families to strengthen our community. At EPIC Early Learning, kids and families come first.

### What We Do:

EPIC provides early learning services and comprehensive wrap-around family support services to over 1,000 low income children and their families each year.

### Where We Are Located:

EPIC Early Learning has programs and classrooms in 7 different school districts across Central & North Central Washington including Yakima, East Valley, West Valley, Naches, Ellensburg, East Wenatchee and Bridgeport.

### How We Are Funded:

EPIC Early Learning receives a \$7M contract from Washington State to provide ECEAP (Early Childhood Education Assistance Program) services to 500 children. We receive a \$14M contract from ESD 105 to provide federal Head Start, Early Head Start, and Migrant Seasonal Head Start services to 512 children as part of the Seedlings Partnership.

Department of Children Youth & Families, ESD 105, West Valley School District and Yakima School District.




# EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAMS

### ECEAP

ECEAP is the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program funded by Washington State for children ages 3 to 5. EPIC receives a contract from Washington State's Department of Children Youth & Families to provide ECEAP services to 500 qualifying children and their families.

# EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Our programs are designed to meet the child's individual needs. Activities allow for individualized instructions, one-to-one interactions with peers and/or adults, and freedom of choice. A well-rounded curriculum is covered throughout the school year. Children grow and develop socially, emotionally, intellectually, and physically.

All services are free and meet the needs of all children. Children are enrolled based on their age, family income, and other developmental or environmental risk factors.

### Program Services Include:

- Free early learning child care or preschool to support child's development and learning.
- Developmental screenings and referrals.
- Nutritious meals and snacks.
- Health and dental screenings.
- Home Visits.
- Parent Leadership Opportunities.
- Family Events.
- Kindergarten Readiness Activities.
- Social development and problem solving.
- Family support and parent involvement.
- Child health coordination and nutrition.
- Services responsive and appropriate to each child's and family's heritage and experience.
- Transportation \*provided in most service areas.

"Since my child started the EPIC program at Mountainview I have noticed a significant difference in his social emotional development, which was one of things I expressed I was having issues with at home. He has demonstrated emotional regulation, and uses his words to express his feelings appropriately. # WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT


We believe in the value of growing our own!

- Over 85% of our Lead Teachers were former Classroom Assistants that returned to school and were promoted to teacher positions. 55% of our Managers worked in another capacity within EPIC, prior to being promoted to their current role. Many of them provided direct services to children before joining EPIC's Management Team.
- 10% of our current staff are former Head Start and/or ECEAP parents and we strive to hire many more!
- EPIC offers a cohort for an ECE State Initial Certificate in partnership with Yakima Valley College. This course offers 12 ECE credits in addition to the certificate, which helps staff meet educational qualifications for their positions. We also utilize EPIC's staff to teach the courses. To date, there have been over 30 participants.
